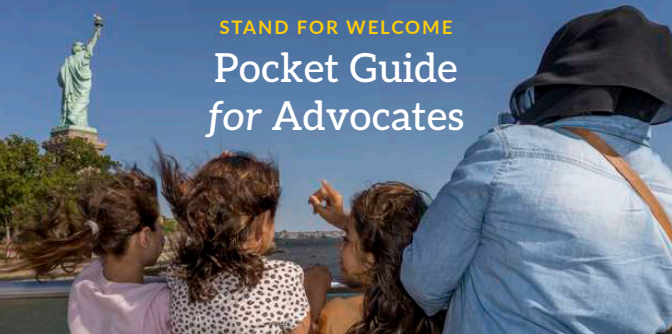

FACTS

Seeking asylum is a **legal right** under U.S. and international law.

📖 1951 Refugee Convention

Initial aid for refugees and asylum seekers is limited, and over time, their **economic contributions exceed** any initial assistance.

📖 US Dept. of Health & Human Services

Refugees undergo **extensive security screenings** (18–24 months). The U.S. vetting process is one of the most rigorous in the world.

📖 UN Refugee Agency

Newcomers often take jobs Americans leave unfilled. Their presence can lead to **job creation** and **economic growth**.

KNOW THE TERMS

Refugee: Forced to flee home due to persecution , conflict or violence and are seeking safety in another country; vetted before entering the U.S.

Asylum Seeker: Already in the U.S. or at the border seeking international protection from dangers in their home country.

Immigrant: A broad term for people moving from one country to another.
