#### KNOW THE TERMS

Refugee: Forced to flee home due to persecution, conflict or violence and are seeking safety in another country; vetted before entering the U.S.

Asylum Seeker: Already in the U.S. or at the border seeking international protection from dangers in their home country.

Immigrant: A broad term for people moving from one country to another.
